From modest beginnings, the Yens' story is one of resilience, entrepreneurial spirit, and a lifelong commitment to learning, growth, and giving back. Their journey from the garment business to the food industry and ultimately to the hospitality sector was not a matter of chance, but rather the result of hard work, humility, and deep dedication to family and community. With their giving hearts, the Yens have touched countless lives both locally and beyond.



#### >>> AN IMMIGRANT COUPLE'S JOURNEY TO SUCCESS In the early 1980s, Annie and Roger met while working together in Taiwan, where

Roger also ran a garment business. Driven by an entrepreneurial spirit, Roger moved to Houston in 1986, seeking better business opportunities. While encountered a limited clothing market, he was introduced to a successful local Chinese restaurant owner that brought him to the restaurant business, which eventually led him into the hospitality industry. Annie joined Roger in 1988 and they embarked on an entrepreneurial journey that would transform their lives. Amidst a challenging economic downturn in the late 1980s, when many business owners were leaving Houston, Roger and Annie chose to stay. With encouragement and support from their friends in the hotel business, they were given the opportunity to manage hotels with Roger

doing building maintenance and Annie manning the front desk. Through hard work, perseverance, and hospitality, they saved enough money to buy their first hotel in 1989. Their success continued as they built a new hotel in 1998, expanding their business over the years. Roger and Annie attribute their success to the strong support of the Asian American community, where hard work and honesty are always valued. They believe that the community becomes stronger when we come together and uplift each other.
